### **Proposed Rules of 2023 Annual Meeting**

1. Only members of the League of Women Voters of Oak Park & River Forest may vote.
2. Only voting members may address the meeting. A member wishing to speak can raise their hand during the meeting, be recognized by the chair, and give her or his name and League position, if held.
3. During debate on a motion, no person may speak more than once until all others who wish to speak have been heard. After the original presentation, debate shall be limited to one minute for each speaker.
4. No announcements shall be made that do not relate to the business of the meeting or the welfare of the members.
5. Procedure for adoption of local program shall be:
  - a. Recommended items shall be moved for adoption by the Vice-President or the Co-President.
  - b. Motion for consideration of any non-recommended items shall be made by majority vote.
  - c. Debate on recommended and non-recommended items shall then be held (items may be amended at this time).
  - d. Recommended items shall be voted upon in their entirety by majority vote.
  - e. Non-recommended items shall be voted on individually (two-thirds vote required).
6. Business of the Annual Meeting shall be further governed by those procedures outlined in *Simplified Parliamentary Procedure* based on *Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised*.
7. These rules may be amended, rescinded, or suspended by a two-thirds vote of the voting members present and voting.

# LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS OF OAK PARK AND RIVER FOREST 2022-2023 PROGRAMS

## Focus/Priority

- *Improve local League website, electronic, and media communications to foster transparency and participation in government.*
  - Recorded all membership information in local and US databases.
  - Continued publication of weekly email and monthly newsletters to members.
  - Continued weekly updates to website with calendar, upcoming events, and photos.
  - Had above-industry average open rate of 63% of weekly emails and newsletters.
  - Encouraged members to use digital version of League directory.
  - Added a sponsor page to the website that recognizes our sponsors while adding links to their websites.
  - Generated 935 followers on Facebook while promoting all virtual events on our social media platforms.
  - Placed ad in Wednesday Journal to promote the Illinois Voters Guide.
  - Throughout the year, we promoted these topics: women, all League fundraisers, special and monthly events, committee meetings, and sister League activities.
  
- *Develop programs/speakers on timely issues as suggested by the Board of Directors or other members. Some committee programs were still done virtually.*
  - Great Discussions groups met in the spring at Brookdale Senior Living and virtually at the Maze Branch Library.
  - The Fall Kickoff was a virtual panel discussion on the role of local journalism on democracy.
  - Drinks & Dialogue had presenters on the Illinois SAFE-T Act and FORA, a Rohingya refugee non-profit support group.
  
- *Continue our voter service efforts to register and provide information to voters.*
  - Registered voters at all Oak Park and River Forest Senior Living Facilities. We also helped them fill out mail ballot applications.
  - Distributed palm cards and postcards with QR codes for voter registration at A Day in Our Village.
  - Sponsored a virtual program on “How to Get and Stay on the Ballot.”
  - Worked with Julian M.S. to supply Pollstar Voting Booths for their mock election.
  - Worked with local organizations and Fair Vote Illinois to promote Ranked Choice Voting in future Oak Park Village Trustee and President elections.
  - Provided resources for students at Dominican University for their “DU Votes” program in which students register students. 101 students were registered at their events.
  - Made a presentation to the Oak Park Village Board about Ranked Choice Voting.
  - Hosted a “Rank Your Beer” event at a local Oak Park brewery to promote Ranked Choice Voting.
  - Worked with local community organizations to promote their Spring Municipal Candidate Forums on our website calendar and provided links to said forums on our website.
  - Worked with local libraries in Oak Park, River Forest, and Forest Park to host six candidate forums in contested races and four candidate statements in uncontested races.

- *Expand membership and encourage participation in League activities through social media and informal social gatherings.*
  - Sent a Welcome Packet to all new members that included a directory, note cards, Bill of Rights bookmark, and made a follow-up call..
  - This was followed up with contact by the appropriate resource person and/or committee chair.
  - Held informal meetings with some new members.
  - Held a raffle for a free membership during Day in Our Village
  - Reported monthly membership totals to the Board.
  - Organized a League social outing and fundraiser to see "Swing State" at the Goodman Theatre.
- *Encourage participation and engage all members in League advocacy and priorities.*
  - Met with local state legislators to discuss League positions.
  - Supported the Oak Park Ordinance to eliminate plastic utensils from restaurant carry-out bags and supported SB100 to ban polystyrene in Illinois restaurants.
  - Posted calls for legislative actions on FB and WIP.
  - Wrote a letter to the editor opposing the Invest in Kids Act.
- *Partner with other community organizations to accomplish shared goals and to increase League visibility.*
  - Organized and ran the June 2022 Resident Board Election at Mills Park Tower.
  - Held presentations on, supported, and promoted the Cook County Forest Preserve November referendum tax increase with distribution of 500 flyers in English and Spanish.
  - Promoted the One Earth Film Festival.
  - Partnered with Brookdale Senior Living and Maze Branch Library for a Spring Great Decisions Program.
  - Partnered with Pilgrim Youth Group for donut sale at Pilgrim Church/Farmer's Market.
  - Actively opposed Invest in Kids legislation.
  - Partnered with Brookdale Senior Living for a New Member Luncheon.
  - Partnered with local libraries for our virtual candidate forums.
  - Held a plant sale fundraiser with Good Earth Greenhouse.
  - Attended Go Green Days at the Oak Park Farmers Market and Barry Fest to educate the public on eliminating use of plastic wraps, plastic bags, and encourage composting.
  - Supported LWV Lake Michigan and LWV Upper Mississippi River Region to prevent toxic waste from being dumped into the Great Lakes.
  - Partnered with Go Plastic Free and Interfaith Green Network to work on mutual goals.

### **Continuous/ Revised**

- *Promote LWWIL tax and school finance positions within our communities and convene studies and discussions of local economic issues as needed.*
  - *Actively advocated for support of Start Smart Early Childhood programs and against the Invest in Kids Act.*
- *Provide support for the environment including sustainability and attention to water as a precious resource.*

- Environment Committee continued work to eliminate single-use plastics by local restaurants.
- Rewarded top ten local restaurants with window sticker acknowledging their work in reducing plastic waste.
- *Continue to be the eyes and ears of our communities by strengthening our Observers Corps.*
  - Received reports on work of LWV CC.
  - Received reports for one or two local monthly board meetings.
  - Worked to recruit more observers of local municipal boards but fell short of goals.
- *Maintain our involvement in coalitions to improve well-being of youth*
- *Support archival development and oral history.*
  - Supported archival development and oral history.
- *Encourage and educate women on how to run for elected office.*
- *Held an ongoing discussion on how best to establish sponsorships/partnerships with local businesses.*
  - *Solicited and received financial sponsorship from twelve local businesses.*

## **Joan Petertil 2023 Hazel Hanson Award Winner**

I have been a member of the League of Women Voters OPRF since 2004, joining primarily because of its advocacy and educational priorities. Since 2015 I served on the Board for seven years, worked on the Nominating Committee for three years, spent four years as a Vice-president and two years as Co-president. I also served on the 2019 State of the Villages committee, was a key member in the League's 501c3 efforts and participated on the 2020 – 2021 Criminal Justice Study group. I have always been interested in politics and actively follow local, state, and federal elections. Although I am leaving the Board, I intend to remain involved through various League committees.

I have an undergraduate degree in Elementary Education from NIU and an MBA from Dominican University. My career has always involved finance or finance-related work including 12 years at CNA Insurance, downtown Chicago, where I met my husband, Jeff Petertil. Once we started a family, I became involved with community work including volunteering at Pilgrim Congregational Church, sitting

on the PTA board, co-leading a Girl Scout troop, and co-chairing the Pilgrim Nursery School Board.

When my daughter was six, I took a part-time fiscal job at Parenthesis Parent Child Center, Oak Park, where I worked for 10 years. This local job afforded me the ability to work and still be home with the kids after school. In 2000, I accepted a challenging and rewarding finance position at the Ounce of Prevention Fund (now Start Early), where I worked for fifteen years. After retiring in 2015, I once again became heavily involved in the community, including volunteering for the OP-RF Community Foundation and being the treasurer at Pilgrim Church. I am an active member of our church choir and with the Sounds Good Choir/Oak Park-River Forest and am currently the Stewardship chair for Pilgrim which includes organizing food donations for the area.

Although I grew up in Chicago, I am a long-term Oak Park resident. Jeff and I raised our lovely children here and are most fortunate that they and our four adorable grandchildren remain nearby in Chicago!
